Programme overview

*Executive Toolbox will transform the way you work, your working relationships, and the organisations you work in.*

## A tailored 6-month programme...

Your job matters to God. You want to lead in a way that glorifies him.

Join us to develop the biblical foundations, practical skills and spiritual practices you need to make a difference for Christ at work.

You'll receive expert training with a cohort of your peers, in three 24-hour residentials over six months.

You'll grow deeper relationships in an accountability triplet, meeting between sessions to support each other in living out what you've learned.



## ...for Christians in workplace leadership

If you:

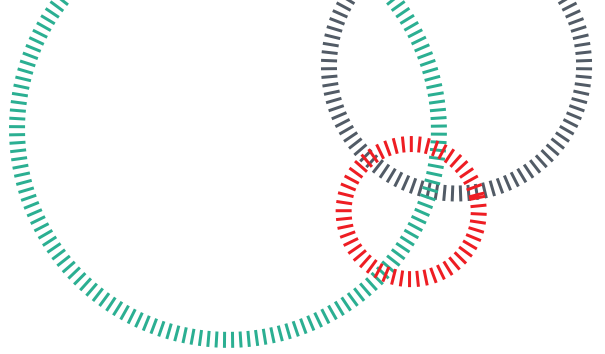
- are a Christian
- hold a mid-to-senior-level leadership role
- work primarily with non-Christians

...then **Executive Toolbox is for you.**

A typical cohort includes business owners, managers, and directors from a wide range of industries, plus head teachers, senior civil servants, and medical leaders.

Our delegates want to grow as disciples in their workplaces. They're keen to apply biblical principles in their working lives. And they want to become more impactful for Christ, right where he's placed them.

Executive Toolbox will put you together with fellow travellers who share the same challenges and opportunities you face.



## Course structure

Three core modules.  
Regular prayer triplet sessions.

Executive Toolbox is built around three modules, run from 6pm on Friday and concluded by 5pm on Saturday. You will need to be able to commit to in-person attendance at all three residentials to qualify. There is space for up to 20 participants on Executive Toolbox.

During these modules, you'll benefit from a varied programme, including direct teaching, case studies, group work, and time for personal reflection.

In between these sessions, you'll meet with two other delegates as a prayer triplet. These virtual sessions will give you a chance to discuss any challenges you're facing at work, share how you've seen God working through you, and support one another in prayer.

To help you get the most out of each session, we'll send you some reading and exercises related to your own work to complete ahead of time – and you'll need to commit to all three residentials.

## Grow your skills in workplace ministry

Each session covers a different key aspect of growth as a Christian at work:

Module 1:

### Seeing Afresh

Learn how to see your job through God's eyes, starting with biblical perspectives on work and exploring how to diagnose and influence workplace culture for him.

- A liberating theology of work
- Diagnosing & shaping workplace culture
- Discerning God's priorities for you

Module 2:

### Relational Impact

Training on how to diagnose and build strong and productive working relationships, and to share your faith in meaningful conversation.

- Growing healthier workplace relationships
- Witnessing in your context
- Creating meaningful conversations

Module 3:

### Lasting Change

Reflect on who you are as a leader and how you can lead at work in a way that glorifies God. This module ends with a short commissioning service.

- Growing as leaders
- What makes a Christian leader different?
- Praying strategically
